HERBAL CULTIVATION FOR THE GROWTH OF CHHATTISGARH

Bharat Mahant lives in Chhota Mandla, a small village in Mahasamund district of Chhattisgarh. His family occupation is farming, but he persuaded his mother Santia Bai Mahant to allow him to cultivate Bach in 20 acres of land. Following suit, Laxmi, a 60-year-old resident also started cultivating Bach and Ashwagandha in 2.25 acres. Not only Mahant and Laxmi but there are many other farmers in Keshwapur, Mahasamund, Raigarh, Jagdalpur who have started cultivating medicinal plants like Kurjanjan Safwan, Tali, Ashwagandha, Devia and Saragandha.

Incidentally, Chhattisgarh has got the third largest forest area in the country with 44 percent of the total geographical area under forest cover. Around 3000 species of medicinal plants are found in the forests of Chhattisgarh. There are about 1500 species of medicinal

plants are surveyed so far, out of which 174 species are cultivated. Among them, the demand for about 25 medicinal plants is very high in the pharmaceutical market. Until now the plants with medicinal properties, were being collected from the forest. However, the state government, under the leadership of Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, realized immense potential for development in this area.

Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, who is committed to the all-round development of this state, says there is enormous potential for the cultivation of medicinal plants. The tribal families and traditional healers living in the forest areas of the state have tremendous knowledge about many of the medicinal plants and herbs. Therefore initiatives are being taken by the government to systematically catalogue and document this traditional knowledge.

Chief Minister Baghel says, "The Chhattisgarh Tribal local health tradition and Medicinal Plant Board has been reconstituted by the state government to promote traditional medical knowledge. Furthermore, serious efforts have also been made to develop the traditional medical system through this initiative. There are plans to run a hospital exclusively by traditional healers in the state capital Raipur, which will be inaugurated shortly."

In an attempt to promote the traditional medical knowledge and increase awareness towards development of medicinal plants, a budget of Rs 10 crore has been approved for the Tribal, Local Health Tradition and Medicinal Plant Board in the year 2021-22. Under the Young Herbal Garden Scheme, the Board has prepared and distributed medicinal plants free of cost to the farmers in 10 districts by the Traditional Vaidya Sangh and other communities. Ashwagandha, Tali, Devia, Saragandha, Awa vera, Bach, and Setaev have been cultivated in 225 acres by 91 farmers in 29

villages under cultivation work by Chhattisgarh Tribal, Local Health Tradition, and Medicinal Plant Board in the year 2020-21. The systematic farming of medicinal plants has definitely increased the income of the farmers.

Chief Minister Baghel asserts, "Government is making all possible efforts to increase the income of farmers. Along with promoting the cultivation of medicinal plants, all possible support is being given to farmers and about Rs 3 crore being spent for processing and value addition of medicinal plants. By setting up small processing plants on plot scale (Bach Peeling Machine, Shatanav Peeling Machine) or Khandia Chute, which will be operational shortly, people associated with the cultivation of medicinal plants will not only get employment in and around their own village but they will also be able to increase their income."

In this phase of the coronavirus pandemic, the people are going back to Ayurveda, believing that the traditional treatment method would boost their immunity and thereby protect them from coronavirus. In such a time, the demand for medicinal plants has also increased substantially. Hence, the price of these medicinal plants has also increased. Therefore, the farmers are being encouraged to go for other medicinal crops also, along with gaddi, through the farming of Amla, Ashok, Jamun, Bari, and other tender species and medicinal plants under the Chief Minister's Tree Plantation Promotion Scheme.

Incidentally, during the pandemic, the demand for medicinal plants has increased tremendously. A study by Galibizen Market Intelligence estimates that the global herbal medicine market will grow at a CAGR of 6.8 percent by 2030. At the same time, according to the study by Nova Research, the revenue of the extract production sector which was \$27.1 billion in 2016 is expected to reach \$44.5 billion by 2024. In the context of India, the B.E.C. study says that the medicinal plant market in the country was \$2 billion in 2019 and it is likely to go up to \$14 billion by 2025 with the possibility of growing at a CAGR of 38.3 percent.

In the light of the above statistics, Chhattisgarh Forest Minister Mahant Babbar says, "Chhattisgarh has a long tradition of conventional medicine and health. In the current scenario of pandemic, the state has greatly benefited by the cultivation of medicinal plants. In terms of usage, the state and the people have got a lot from it. It will be of great benefit." Medicinal plants are widely used in various Indian systems of medicine like Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani and Homeopathy.

According to I.A.C.S. Rao, CEO, Medicinal Plants Board, "We should leverage the power of the herbal market to benefit our farmers as there is a huge demand for medicinal plants in the domestic and international market. The state is endowed with a wide variety of soils and climates. Farmers should also be encouraged to cultivate medicinal plants because they will get more benefits with less input. There are around 10 lakh traditional Vaidya or traditional healers in the country. Their demand will have to be met regularly."

Balvishwa Pathak, chairman of the Medicinal Plant Board says, "With a Rs 30,000 to Rs 1, 50,000 per acre in investment in the farming of medicinal plants, the cropping period is from 5 months to 12 months. While some crops like Saragandha, Sada Anardana may fetch Rs 10 to 15 lakhs in one acre in 18 months period, for other crops,

Some of the medicinal plants have been cultivated in the state. However, most of the other products are still collected from the forest. Right now the names of medicines prepared from different forest products are local. Therefore, it is indeed a kind of a challenge to maintain the statistics of their business in terms of the national or international market. Moreover, the supply chain of these herbal medicines is also not quite satisfactory, and managing the existing resources is also a difficult proposition at the moment." So we have designed a strategy to strengthen the resource base of medicinal plants," says Rao. In fact, the Global Herbal Market is a unique platform for supporting the medicinal plant producers, for a number of unique items are found in this state, such as Ravana (Shankh), Glory Lily (oil over the stem), Saragandha (Berberis), Shudhoochi (Shakarjodh), Juhva Jambhaga (Bharati), Dehman (Solesta bacc) are the natural wealth of Chhattisgarh.

Medicinal Plants Board in the state has taken many steps for developing the cultivation of medicinal plants and herbs. For example, intensive sowing and plantation campaign has been taken up for cultivating high demand medicinal plants, in 12 forest divisions. Around 15 lakh saplings of Sataev, Anardana, Haldi, Gurji, Gily, Kadamphal have been planted. Intensive cultivation of Setaev, Saragandha, Awa vera, Bach, Setaev, Ashwagandha, Tali, etc. has been started in cluster method, on the lands of farmers.

Apart from this, the Medicinal Plants Board has also developed a gene bank of quality germplasm having unique chemical structure. Due to the favorable climate, the Board has also started the plantation of saplings like Sada Anardana (Ocotelea) for the first time in the state as they are in high demand and high income yielding. The Board has started creating awareness among the people through herbal garden.

Last but not the least, C.I.M.P.A. (Lucknow, Bangalore, Hyderabad), I.I.M. (Dumrao), D.M.A.P.R. (Raipur), and local universities have been consulted to maintain the quality in the farming and other related technologies regarding medicinal plants and herbs. The experts from these premier institutions would share their knowledge for the betterment of the farming of medicinal plants and herbs.
